Commercial Waste, Demolition Material	\$70.00 per tonne (\$10.00 Min Charge)
<b>YARD WASTE – (Unbagged &amp; Tarped)</b>	
Grass Clippings, Tree Branches and Leaves	No Charge (Dumped In Compost Area)
Clean Wood, Tree Branches, Tree Trunks, Tree Stumps & Pallets	\$60.00 per tonne (\$10.00 Min Charge)
<b>STEEL, ALUMINUM, WHITE GOODS, ETC.</b>	Not Allowed (Deliver to Salvage Vendors)
<b>DEAD ANIMALS – (no more than two (2) animals per load will be accepted)</b>
